Don't forget to save your empty shoeboxes from back to school



LOCKDOWN DRILL

This Wednesday, October 5, the Crystal Lake Police Department will be on site to conduct a state mandat-

ed Lock Down Drill. The scenario would be that there is an intruder in the building and students and staff are to take cover and stay completely out of site behind locked doors. This is just one of several drills which are conducted through-



out the school year. We have already had 2 evacuation drills (one observed by the Crystal Lake Fire Department) and a bus evacuation drill conducted by the District 47 & District 155 Transportation cooperative. Later on in the early spring, we will conduct a severe weather drill as well.
